■ MONDAY, AUGUST 3 B, L

Follow the route of the Klondike gold stampeders in style to Whitehorse, Northern Canada's largest city sprang from frontier roots. During the Klondike Gold Rush, prospectors washed up here, past two major river obstacles: Miles Canyon and the Whitehorse Rapids. To prevent mass starvation, the government required every Stampeders to haul along a year's supply of goods.

■ **TUESDAY, AUGUST 4** B, L, D

Make your way from Whitehorse to Skagway. Bid Farwell to your Journey Host, then enjoy the historic White Pass Summit trail. Against all odds, this iron trail was built through some of the North's most ruggedly beautiful terrain and, more than 125 years later, is still in operation. Ride in a comfortable, restored vintage rail car to the summit of the White Pass, through two tunnels, over sky-high trestles, and remote valleys, before embarking on the Koningsdam.

■ **WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 5** B, L, D

Cruise the ice-studded fjords of this national treasure for a full eight hours as a Park Service Ranger narrates. Get your cameras ready to capture beautiful sites on your Glacier Bay Cruise. Frosted peaks towering over mossy forests, wide tidewater glaciers (there are seven in the park), and marine wildlife are givens on Glacier Bay cruises, but every experience in this changing biosphere is unique.



White Pass Summit Rail

■ **THURSDAY, AUGUST 6** B, L, D

Explore this uniquely Alaskan port, famous for its rich native culture, salmon fishing, and scenic Misty Fjords. Take an adventure and cruise to Ketchikan, Alaska. Alaska's "First City" of Ketchikan is so named because it's the first major landfall for most cruisers as they enter the picturesque fjords of the Inside Passage, where the town clings to the banks of the Tongass Narrows, flanked by green forests nurtured by abundant rain.

How to book: Reservations may be made through any CAA Niagara office with a travel agent. A non-refundable deposit of \$1,500 per person is due at time of booking. Balance of payment is due April 8, 2026. CAA strongly recommends the purchase of travel insurance. Ask for details.

Cancellation charges: Should it be necessary to cancel your trip prior to departure, the following penalties will apply:

Prior to April 8	Deposit paid non-refundable
April 9 to May 7	50% non-refundable
May 8 to July 28	100% non-refundable

The day of departure is excluded when calculating cancellation charges. CAA strongly recommends the purchase of cancellation insurance.
